I'm a music kind of guy. I love all kinds of music because it taps into my spirit. Music can set my mood or change it. Music can express how I'm feeling or how I want to feel. Music can take me somewhere exotic or plant my feet firmly in the reality of here and now.

I've heard two songs this week that are stuck in my head: "June is busting out all over!" from *Carousel*, and Elton John singing "The Circle of Life" from *The Lion King*.

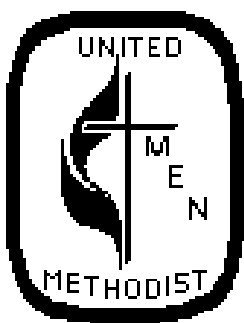

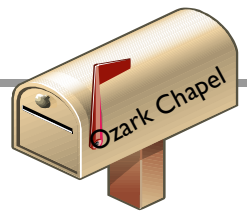
